### **Boughton VE Day Party**

2005 marked 60 years since the declaration of peace at the end of the Second World War. Various celebrations were organised throughout the country and the National Lottery Fund made money available to organisations who wanted to mark this occasion.

One of the ways of marking the occasion was to hold a street party involving both old and young, similar to those held throughout the country sixty years before.

They were given the opportunity to dress up in 1940s clothes, games were organised, a military vehicle of the time was on show and plenty of food and drink was available to make the afternoon enjoyable!

The event was very well attended and those who made the effort enjoyed themselves. Almost all the monies received from the National Lottery Fund were spent on consumables, but the village did benefit from the occasion by receiving 5 small notice boards and two folding trestle tables.

The aim was to remember and thank those people who contributed towards the war effort and to promote community spirit today.

It may be your parents or grandparents, but they will probably be only too happy to tell you where they were and what was happening to them and perhaps lend you some memorabilia to use on your board.

The storyboards will be on display in the church on Sunday morning, 21st August and probably for a few days afterwards. They can be produced by adults or children. It will be very interesting to see how the war affected the lives of ordinary people.
