After due notices on doors of places of worship
the Parish Meeting was held in the Sunday
Schoolroom as previously

The Rector of the Parish (chairman), the overseer,
W. R. Harwin, and others were present.
The Chairman read the letter of reply from
the County Council, and from the Trustees
of Herman's Charity, Oxborough, and he
explained that it was now necessary to
decide what land at Boughton was suitable
for allotments, and to learn if any of such
land can be acquired by agreement
and to consider what further action was to be
taken.

It was proposed, seconded, and carried
that the field, Common hot., the property of
the Oxborough Trustees, field 10 acres, on the
boundary of Boughton Parish and abutting
on the Stoke Ferry Road, the property of W.
R. Harwin, and big crofts, abutting on the
Parish road to Boughton ten., the property
of Sir. H. Bedingfield, be suitable for the
allotments.

No other resolution was proposed at the
meeting. A vote of thanks was given to W.
Harwin for the use of his Schoolroom.
