The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the School on Monday March 27. Present
Rev J.S. Beloe. Misses E. Moore & Mabel ^{R. Robinson}
W. Clark. William Clarke, G. Clarke, R. Mrs S. Pitt
J. Lambert. C. Savage. H. Bray. H. Hall & J. Hall.
and others including G. B. Hill. J. B. Hill.

Minutes of the last meeting were read & carried that
J. Hall be Chairman for the ensuing year.
Letters were read by the Chairman from
Read & W.L. Hawkins & W.L. Brown ^{to Mr. Tom the Solicitor}
confirmed representing Mr. Fitz. Marks objecting to the
proposed action of erecting Stiles on the
footpath between Covenham Corner & The Church.
Mr. Hall proposed & Rev J.S. Beloe seconded
that the dispute about the right of way
for greatest gain be referred to the P.D.C.
This is for the foot-path between Covenham
Corner & The Church.

Mr. Walter Clarke called the attention of the
Meeting to the bad state of the Stiles
on the foot-path between Boughlin & Hereford.
Mr. Walter Clarke proposed & H. Hall seconded
that the Chairman be asked to get a Stile
erected over the first fence on the above foot-path
& to write to the Chairman of Hereford Parish
Council & ask them to erect Stiles over those
fences in Hereford Parish on the same foot-path.
Mr. C. Marks proposed & H. Hall seconded that
the P.D.C. be written too & call their attention
to Three-Blind Corners. one beside the Bell & the
other two at the top of Wrekin Lane. Rev J.S. Beloe
asked also that a path be made for the School
children between Mr. Robinson's entrance & the first
Rectory field gate.

Some discussion arose on having a new

for The Parish Land. Several Pts in Mr Marks
& a Chalk Pt in Mr. Mortes Land. Mr. Beloe
remarked that an Agreement was not necessary
for a yearly Tenancy. Conversation also
also about the importance of having these
pieces of Parish Land marked out.
At last it was decided to leave things
as they were, Mr. Marks agreeing not
to have any agreement. Mr. Hall remarked
that he had paid the Tithe of 13/- on
The Parish Land. Mr. Beloe very generously
said he would write to Mr. Jackson the
Tithe Collector & ask him not to collect
it from The Parish again, or ~~but~~ others
words he will forego that amount.
This concluded the business.

Blind Corner Aiding out of the Minutes it was stated that The Blind Corner near The Bell was not done. — Mr. H. Wilson said that at the last meeting of the Downham R. D. Council The Surveyor stated that he had come to an agreement with Messrs Ballard & the work would be started at once with Relief Labour.

R.D.C. Cleaning the Pit. The Chairman read a letter from D. R. D. C. referring this to The Parish Meeting. It was decided to do nothing in the matter.

Church Lane A letter was also read from the D. R. D. C. respecting the repair of Church Lane. It was stated that during Mr. Parnott's Surveyorship a drain was laid by the ~~Roadman~~ the Roadman. Foot Path

The Chairman said that he met Mr. Hynd in Lynn. — who said that he intended to call a meeting of Mr. Marks, Mr. Hawkins & Mr. Hall to represent the Parish) to see if this matter could not be settled by agreement. Water Supply A letter was read by the Chairman from Mr. Hynd saying that a piped service for the Parish would involve considerable expense & to meet this a rate of 4/- in the £ would be required in the village.

Another scheme was suggested viz. That a Pump & well be installed leaving the Parishioners to fetch their own supply of water.

Mr. H. Wilson proposed & Mr. H. Hall seconded that the Pump be put in. As no one else supported it was lost. The Chairman was asked to write to the D. P. D. C. for ~~more~~ information as regards the Government Grant. — that is what amount we should get towards this water scheme. A considerable portion of the Parish is badly in need of a water supply & it is hoped that some
