The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the School on Monday March 27. Present Rev J. S. Beloe. Messrs E. Moxley & Moxley, Robinson, H. Clarke, William Clarke, S. Clarke, R. R. S. R. S. J. Lombert, C. Savage, H. R. H. Hall & J. Hall and others including G. Pettit & J. Pettit.

The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed

It was proposed & seconded & carried that J. Hall be Chairman for the ensuing year. Petitions were read by the Chairman from read & Mr L. Hawkins & Mr L. Brown. Some the Solicitor representing Mr. Fitz. Moxley objecting to the proposed action of erecting styles on the footpath between Cavenham Corner & The Church. Mr. J. Hall proposed & Rev J. S. Beloe seconded that the dispute about the right of way for pedestrians be referred to the R. & C. This is for the foot-path between Cavenham Corner & The Church.

Mr Walter Clarke called the attention of the meeting to the bad state of the styles on the foot-path between Boughlin & Melcham. Mr. Walter Clarke proposed & H. Hall seconded that the Chairman be asked to get a style erected over the fence on the above foot-path & to write to the Chairman of Melcham Parish Council & ask them to erect styles over those fences in Melcham Parish on the same foot-path. Mr E. Moxley proposed & H. Hall seconded that the R. & C. be written too & call their attention to three blind corners. one beside The Bell & the other two at the top of Melton Lane. Rev J. S. Beloe asked also that a path be made for the School Children between Mr Robinson entrance gate & the first Rectory field gate.

remarked that an Agreement was not necessary
for a yearly Tenancy. Conversation also
also about the importance of having these
pieces of Parish Land marked out.
At last it was decided to leave things
as they were, Mr. Marks agreeing not
to have any agreement. Mr. Hall remarked
that he had paid the Tithe of 1876 on
the Parish Land. Mr. Beloe very generously
said he would write to Mr. Jackson the
Tithe Collector & ask him not to collect
it from the Parish again. Or ~~that~~ others
would he will forego that amount.

The Chairman said that he met Mr. Syner in Lynn. — who said that he intended to call a meeting of Mr. Marks, Mr. Hawkins, & (Mr. Hall to represent The Parish) to see if this matter could not be settled by agreement. A letter was read by The Chairman from Mr. Syner saying that a piped service for the Parish would involve considerable expense & to meet this a rate of 4/7 in the £ would be required in the village.

Another scheme was suggested viz. That a Pump & well be installed leaving the Parishioners to fetch their own supply of water.

Mr. H. Wilson proposed & Mr. H. Hall seconded that The Pump be put in. As no one else supported it was lost. The Chairman was asked to write to the D. R. & C. for information as regards the Government Grant. — that is what amount we would get towards this water scheme.
