The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the School Rooms at 7 pm. on the evening of <sup>Wednesday</sup> the 29<sup>th</sup> March, due notice having been posted on the Parish board, in the Church porch and one handed in to the post office.

There were present Mr. R. G. Robinson, Mr. F. Savage, & Mr. R. Payne and the chairman, who presided.

The chairman then apologised for the absence of annual meetings for the past two years and after reading the minutes for 1959 & 1960 it was understood by the meeting present why these <sup>meetings</sup> had not been held and the minutes were duly signed and approved.

The chairman then stated, as he was no longer living in the village of Boughton, that he was willing to resign and allow the meeting to elect another chairman or, if they so wished, he would be happy to carry on the work as chairman from where he was now living. It was proposed by Mr. R. G. Robinson & seconded by Mr. R. Payne that the chairman should remain in office.

A discussion was then held on "Public Rights of Way" in particular to the one relating to Boughton. The chairman stated that he had heard nothing more from Mr. Harrison or the Norfolk County Council. He promised to see Mr. Harrison again as soon as possible. On the subject of the plague of flies recently in the village the chairman said that Mr. Sennett, the Rural District Council Sanitary Officer, had the matter in hand and he would call upon him again in the course of the next few days. The chairman had seen Mr. Walton from the Old Rectory in the Village and had promised to let him know Mr. Sennett's findings on the question of the fly nuisance.

The Chairman then asked the meeting if there was anyone present who could say who was the present lord of the manor of Broughton, or if these rights had been sold. As no definite conclusion could be reached it was agreed that the Chairman should ask Mr. Charles Hawkins in Downham Market if he could throw any light on the subject and, if not, that the previous Chairman, Mr. E. Marks, who had now left the district, should be written to.

There being no further business to discuss the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
