

A Parish Meeting was held on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> February 1977 in the Schoolroom, at 7.15 pm due notice having been posted.

Present - Mr F. Savage, Mrs F. Savage, Mr C. Arnosby, Mr W. Gossdall, Mrs W. Gossdall, Mrs R. Carter, Mrs M. Carter, Mr P. Smith, Mrs J. Cowinson (District Councillor) and the Chairman.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read, approved & signed.

The Chairman welcomed Mrs Cowinson, the District Councillor.

She read out correspondence from the N.C.C. Adult Literacy Project - asking for literature to be displayed & for anyone interested in the Project or <sup>gave</sup> help in assisting others in helping people to read.

There was a letter from regarding the Sister Ferry inter-village Quiz contest - asking for a team of four. Mr P. Smith volunteered to try & name a Team & to let the Chairman know the names.

A letter from the Imperial Cancer Research Fund sending grateful thanks for the sum of £31.15 raised by carol-singers at Christmas tide.

There was notification of Planning Refusal for the two large executive type houses planned to be built on D.S. 57 - opposite the plot by Messrs B&D Developments. The Chairman thanked the District Councillor for his great help in this matter, & also informed the Meeting that the plot of land had outline planning permission for two bungalows.

A letter was received from the Eastern Electricity Board - asking for a local contact for Emergency liaison information centre - Mr F. Savage kindly offered to take this on as he was central in the Village.

There was a letter from W.N.D.C regarding a letter

from Norfolk County Council, about a special Service for Local Authority & Parish Councillors to be held to celebrate the Queen's Silver Jubilee - on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> July at 10.30 am. Any interested to give their names to Mr Payne. Mrs Payne then said the Meeting that she & the District Councillor (~~concerned~~) were starting to hold local 'Surgeries' in the Villages in Heligay Division. The first one to be held on 15<sup>th</sup> February at Stoke Ferry. They would be available for personal & private help & advice - entirely non-political. She said if it was felt that Boughton would like this service. The Meeting felt that as Mrs Payne lived in the village & was readily available & Mr Canson was also local & well known, that surgeons were unnecessary but it was suggested that the Tel. numbers of both County & District Councillors be put on the Village notice board.

The Chairman then explained the object & aims of the Silver Jubilee Appeal Fund to be organised Nation-wide. In Norfolk they were hoping to raise £80,000, £16,000 of which would be West Norfolk's share. The Province of Wales was organising its appeal & would be on T.V. & wireless. It was stated that the fund would go towards youth to help in projects & facilities & that at least 50% would be kept in the <sup>total</sup> <sup>Local</sup> <sup>Area</sup>. It was suggested that boxes could be made available for contributions in the Shrops. Post Office but that any fund raising be left until the Autumn. The Meeting then went on to discuss the arrangements for the Silver Jubilee Celebrations in Boughton. Mr Payne reported that she had

provisionally booked up from Part of Setch for a sit down tea - menu & numbers to be decided later. Mr Savage & Mrs Page volunteered to look into prices of wine or sherry. As well as chessmen games & a social after the tea, it was decided to ask if Mr Ron Munday could come to entertain for a short while. Mr Page to find out his charges. The evening would conclude with dancing & community singing.

After further discussion it was also decided to arrange sports & games for the children during the morning & afternoon.

Mr P. Smith said he could obtain a corrugated marquee on loan from the USAF. This was gratefully accepted. He also could provide red white & blue decorations for the Hall School.

Mr Page suggested 4 or 5 long poles with Union Jacks on top - to go round the village pond. This was thought a good idea.

The question of provision of S. Jubilee memorabilia for the children was discussed. It was decided to look into the possibility of presenting each child with a commemorative crown or set of coins. Mr Page volunteered to investigate prices.

It was further decided to present to the School either a shield or Trophy - Mrs Page to liaise with Mr Frost, the Schoolmaster - possibly for the child showing the most progress in the year.

Being no further business the meeting was then closed.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Schoolroom on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> March 1977 <sup>at 7.15p.m.</sup> the notice having been posted.

Minutes. Mrs Payne read the minutes of the last Meeting, which were duly approved & signed.

Business Arising: These consisted of reports on the progress of the Cuban Jubilee Celebrations & were taken under that item on the Agenda.

Business. Election of New Chairman: Mrs Payne asked for nominations as she gave notice last year that she wished to resign from the post, due to pressure of work. No nominations were forthcoming, and Mrs Payne promised to continue for ~~the~~ <sup>one</sup> further year, but it must be the last. Mrs J. Savage thanked the Chairman for the 12 years service she had given.

Correspondence was then read: letter of thanks from the Eastern Electricity Board for Mr F. Savage to take on the liaison in case of emergencies. The Annual Report from the Norfolk Society & statement of Accounts letter from the Anglian Water Authority asking for information on road or large amounts of farmland flooding.

The Report of the Local Government Boundary Commission sent by the West Norfolk District Council. It contained gardeners offering grass cutting. A letter from the King's Lynn Community Health Council asking for information on parishioners difficulties in getting to Doctors, surgeries, pharmacists & dentists. A letter from the West Norfolk District Council, informing the Parish that on 17<sup>th</sup> March 1977 the District Council designated Broughton

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Village as a Conservation Area. Two maps were enclosed - showing the area concerned.

The Norfolk County Council sent a letter & forms for entry for the Best Kept Village Competition for 1977, but pointing out that as Boughton had won the Best Kept Village Green <sup>Section</sup> for two consecutive years - that they were not eligible to enter that section this year. It was decided however to enter the Best Kept Village & Best Kept Churchyard sections.

Mr Payne reported that the state of finance was at 30th March Boughton Parish Meeting Account £21.82 & the Boughton Improvements Fund £183.54. She asked for approval for the transfer of £30 from the Improvements Fund to the Parish Meeting Account which was overdrawn.

This was accepted by all present.

The Meeting then went on to discuss the Silver Jubilee arrangements. The Chairman stated that Mr P. Smith had confirmed that the Marquee would be available on loan from the USAF. After that the sit down Tea had been provisionally arranged from Morris Butlers of Sleaford - the menu was discussed & it was decided to have their No. 4. menu. Chutney & Ham salad, rolls, steamed jacket, cakes, Tea, coffee & sandwiches for £1.50 per head - each person to pay for their own ticket, but children would be paid for by the Parish. It was decided to purchase Pommery sparkling cider for 2 glasses per head & soft drinks for the children.

Mr Payne reported that an entertainment had been booked Mr Ron McLean - at a cost of £20. Getting someone to look after the record player stated <sup>her</sup> - people were requested to bring their own records - so there would be all types of music from disco to rock. There would be games for the children - dancing for

all ages, followed by community singing, with Mrs Wallam at the piano. Mr Page reported that Mrs Conde Smith had made 4 large Union Jacks at a cost of £4 each, & that 46 Crown pieces had been ordered from the bank for all the schoolchildren. Bought up to 16 years. Also a cup would be presented to the school & would be won each year for the best handwriting - at the request of the Schoolmaster. Mrs Proctor, Mr Shipton & Mr C. Annsby agreed to arrange a treasure hunt for the children - during the afternoon. Mrs Page said that a special outdoor service would be held on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June - with everyone invited.

It was suggested that if the weather was fine the tea could be held on the green - <sup>under</sup> on the marquee. The chairman suggested that some project for the village might be started - a jubilee year - such as provision of a bowling green. The opinion was that it might be too costly or even more grass cutting! The Meeting decided to try & think up another project, & that a suggestion box would be placed - in the village shop. Mr Savage said he had thought of having a coffee morning & buying & buying stalls & raffle to aid the Jubilee funds. He asked for all Draw Tickets to be in by Saturday, ready for the Draw on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> April.

Mr C. Annsby asked if there were any fish in the pond & if it could be re-stocked. The Chairman said she would contact the River Authority to see if they would undertake this <sup>for</sup> before next season.

Mr Page said that it would be helpful to have an MC for the Celebrations Evening. Mr K. Miller was to be asked & Mr P. Smith said he would act as stand-in.

Being no further business the Meeting was closed at 8.49 p.m.

Minutes The Chairman read the minutes of the last meeting - which were approved & signed.

#### Business Arising

The chairman congratulated everyone who had helped towards keeping Boulton tidy & helping it to win the Best Kept Village Award this year.

The ceremony was held on 23rd August at 10.30 am.

Presentations were made by Mr Eric Fowler, "Jonathan Mardle" of the Eastern Daily Press, who also unveiled the Best Kept Village sign. Refreshments were served afterwards from Mrs Smith's house. Mr Bert Armstrong received the award. A letter of thanks for organising the presentation ceremony and for the excellent refreshments, was sent by the Acting County Planning Officer <sup>sent</sup> & thanks from the Best Kept Village Competition joint committee.

The Chairman <sup>presented</sup> the Jubilee Accounts which were then passed round for inspection & commented on the very satisfactory result that due to the raffle & coffee morning only £19.32 was paid out of <sup>Improvements</sup> ~~Banquet~~ funds. Everyone paid for their own meal but schoolchildren were paid for by the Parish.

Christmas arrangements were then discussed and it was decided to hold a Christmas Party for all the village - all ages - on January 7<sup>th</sup> 1977. A notice would be sent to every house asking if they would like to come & if they could provide some refreshments.

The Chairman then asked the Meeting if it was their wish to have a Fete in 1977. It was agreed unanimously to hold a fete on Saturday June 17<sup>th</sup>. It was further decided that the Chairman should ask Lady Evershed to open the Fete, and failing her, Mrs Eric Fowler (Jonathan Mandel) of the E.D.P.

Being no other business, the Meeting was declared closed.
