The chairman discussed the
merits of precepts as a means

of financing the upkeep of the parish. In view of the changing population and shortage of volunteers for events. It seemed a fairer way of sharing the cost.

For 18 Against 2

The motion was carried.

There was some discussion about people riding horses in the village pond. Mr Grimwade asked about ownership of land on Boughton Fen and in particular that owned by Mr R Smith. The chairman explained that since Mr R Smith had enjoyed free use of a small parcel of land for more than 20 years he had laid claim to it and now seemed to have a valid legal title to it.

Mrs Payne announced that people would be allowed to visit Boughton wood on Sunday 06th May and that she would provide teas and collect for church funds.

A number of parishioners complained about highway problems. The parking places on the Gibbet road were poorly sited, too small and required signs. Road signs at the village centre were either missing or in a poor state. The overflow pipe from the village pond had been damaged and was obstructed. Roadside drains at

bavenham corner were obstructed so that the road remained flooded after storms.

The chairman agreed to write to the Divisional Surveyor to ask him to take action necessary to correct the problems.

Mrs Payne suggested that the parish send a letter of sympathy to Mrs Bowson since she was just recovering from a serious illness. The chairman agreed to do so.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting closed at 2040 hrs.
