Business Arising.

The village fête on Saturday 18th June 1994 raised £586.55. Village banked £223.55 remaining £363.00 went to the church. Annual precept of £140 was taken into account in dividing the cash.

The English Nature scheme to improve the Boughton Fen SSSI had been started. Grant for the work being paid direct to English Nature with an annual grant of £100 being paid to the parish for the next 5 years.

Mr Buckton the county councillor for the area had been contacted about the pond on the bend on Gibbett Lane. After much research he had concluded that, since the pond was private property no action could be taken without the owners consent.

Old bus shelter had been demolished, after much discussion it was decided to extend the notice board sufficient for a shelter.

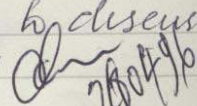
Mr J Savage commented on the nuisance being caused by people fishing in the pond. A lengthy discussion took place but no action was recommended.
